COMMUNICATIONS 496 Application for Independent Study

INSTRUCTIONS:

Although not specifically designated an "honors" course, COMM 496 is planned primarily for the superior undergraduate student who has achieved 6th semester standing. It provides him/her an opportunity to broaden his/her background, conduct scholarly research, and carry out professional projects in communications that do not fit into conventional classroom programs. In all cases, the course will involve the preparation of a major report. The student project will not be as extensive as the production of a master's thesis, but it will require more effort than an ordinary semester paper. The report may be either a "scholarly" production or a "journalistic" one – these descriptions need be considered mutually exclusive.

Two general types of projects will be acceptable:

- 1. The student may choose some phase of mass communications for study and examine and investigate it from the standpoint of a scholar. His/her written result might be in the nature of a monograph or article for a scholarly or professional publication.
- 2. The student may choose a problem or topic that he/she would like to address involving mass communication. His/her project might be a series of newspaper interpretive articles or features, a magazine article or articles, a radio or television documentary, or photographic series.

Before submitting this application, the student should discuss his/her proposed independent study project with his/her advisor and then with the faculty supervisor of his/her independent study project. The student may not register for 496 until an approved application is on file.
